

Print Resources (Book, Magazine, Encyclopedia)

Book—One author	Last Name, First Name. <u>Title</u>. Place: Publisher, Date.
	Sheftel-Gomes, Nasoan. <u>Everything You Need to Know About Racism</u> . New York: Rosen Publishing Group, Inc., 1998.

Editor, Compiler instead of Author	Last Name, First Name, ed. <u>Title</u>. Place: Publisher, Date.
	Mitchell, Hayley R., ed. <u>The Death Penalty</u> . San Diego: Greenhaven Press, Inc., 2001.

Note: When listing multiple authors or editors, use the following examples:

<p>Two authors: Last Name, First Name, and First Name Last Name.</p>	<p>Three authors: Last Name, First Name, First Name Last Name, and First Name Last Name.</p>
<p>Two editors: Last Name, First Name, and First Name Last Name, eds.</p>	<p>Three editors: Last Name, First Name, First Name Last Name, and First Name Last Name, eds.</p>

Note: Use “et al” when more than 3 authors or editors are listed. Write the name of the first person listed, then a comma, then “et al” followed by a period (see example in the next citation). If editors, put “et al” followed by a comma, and then “eds.”

	Month Year: pages.

Printed Newspaper Article—Author Listed	Last name, First Name. "Article Title." <u>Newspaper Title</u>. Day
	Month Year, Edition: SectionPage.
	Tuinstra, Rachel. "Microsoft Expansion Plans Approved by City Council." <u>The Seattle Times</u> 19 May 2005: B3.
