A THANK YOU AND AN INVITATION FROM THE EASTLAKE LIBRARY

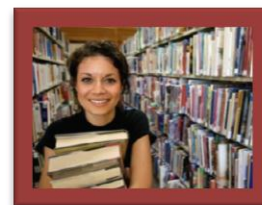

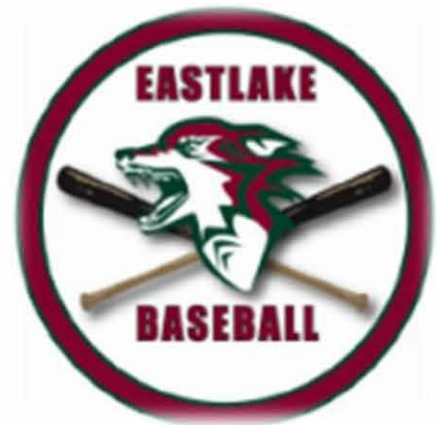

The Aviation Academy is looking for students (ages 13 -18) who have an aptitude or interest in or just a curiosity about aviation.
