

“INDIVIDUAL” LEADERSHIP PROJECT

DESCRIPTION: 15% - **Individual Project** – each of you are in charge of making Inglewood a better place. **You must first have your project** approved by me by **September 21**. In order to get your project approved you must fill out the **Individual Project Planning Guide** in this packet. Just because it is an individual project does not mean you can't have help from other students in achieving your goal. The final project must be finished before the last week of the semester.

THE WORK

RATIONALE:

In a minimum of one page, describe what the project is that you completed. You must discuss why you felt your project was needed at Inglewood. Also, you must include your rationale of how your project made Inglewood a better place.

EVIDENCE:

Please attach evidence of your project to your rationale. The evidence can take the form of a photograph, another person's written commentary upon seeing/experiencing project, etc. If you are unsure how to prove your project's existence, please ask me.

REFLECTION:

Another piece of your individual project will be a written reflection. In this 2-3 paragraph reflection, you will discuss how your contribution to Inglewood made you feel, how you might have done it differently if to do it again, and why you never thought to do it or did it before.

PRESENTATION:

The final piece of the project is to present your work to the class. You will briefly explain what you did, why you did it, and your feelings while doing, and upon completing, the project. This will be 1-3 minutes in length.

Your grade on this project is composed of 5 different sections and is worth 15% of your semester grade. Each of these sections (Planning, Rationale, Evidence, Reflection, and Presentation) is all or nothing. If you complete all the necessary components in that section and you receive an A. If you do not fulfill the requirements, you fail that section of the assignment.
