Cambridge International Examinations Honor Code 2011 – 2012

The Cambridge Program offers a quality education that not only ensures knowledge, but cultivates the virtues of honor, courtesy, and perseverance. Of these virtues, honor is of great importance, for it is personal integrity that will influence and finally determine many of our actions and beliefs. Students should consider this Honor Code to be enforced in all Cambridge classes, non-Cambridge classes and all activities associated with Juanita High School.

Simply stated, The Honor Code is:

Students shall be honor bound to refrain from cheating of every kind, including plagiarism. Students shall be honor bound to take actions to stop any and all violations of this Honor Code, which they see or have knowledge of. Inaction implies that one condones inappropriate behavior. Living in a manner that is consistent with this code will produce an atmosphere of trust, freedom, and integrity necessary to the success of each student in the program. Without maintaining a high standard of honesty and conduct, the reputation of the school and of Cambridge Preparatory Academy is compromised and society is poorly served.

What constitutes cheating?

- Plagiarism - using any resource without attribution, substituting another's work as your own.
- Copying homework.
- Looking at someone's paper or giving answers.
- Using unauthorized cheat sheets.
- Sharing test questions.
- Having disallowed pre-programmed formulas and/or programs on calculators used for tests.
- Any behavior that could reasonably be construed as cheating.

There are occasions when collaboration between candidates is permitted or even actively encouraged. Nevertheless, the final work must be produced independently, despite the fact that it may be based on similar data. This means that the abstract, introduction, content and conclusion or summary of a piece of work must be written in each candidate's own words and cannot therefore be the same as another candidate's. If, for example, two or more candidates have exactly the same introduction to an assignment, staff will construe this as collusion (cheating) and not collaboration.

Special attention must be given to the avoidance of plagiarism of internet resources. Because of the ease of copy/paste techniques, students must be sure these sources are used appropriately. Note that many Juanita teachers use turnitin.com to ensure appropriate use of sources.

The following penalties will be enforced in the Juanita High School Cambridge Program. The first time a student is caught cheating on a class assignment or assessment, he/she will receive a zero for that assignment or assessment. In addition, a conference will be convened with the parents, the student, and an administrator. The student will be placed on a strict academic probation for the rest of his/her attendance in the Juanita Cambridge Program. All Cambridge teachers will be informed that this student is on academic probation for violation of the Honor Code. The student must diligently refrain from even the casual appearance of potential of cheating in every class. If the student is caught cheating again in any class before his/her graduation from the program, the student may be removed from the program. If the student does not live in the Juanita attendance area, his/her enrollment at Juanita High School will be cancelled and he/she will be required to return to his/her home school. Appeals to this penalty may be made to the Lake Washington School Board or designee.

A separate policy must be in place in the case of malpractice on an assessment scheduled to be sent to the Cambridge examiners. If a student is caught cheating during the testing process, or plagiarizing any of his/her assessments, he/she will receive a zero for that assessment. There is no intermediary warning step in this case. The student will still be responsible for the cost of that subject registration, however.

Lottery/Wait List Policy and Procedures

- The lottery is a blind, computer-generated process which will be conducted by Dr. Traci Pierce, Chief Schools Officer, at the Lake Washington District Office. The lottery selection will be conducted on February 3, 2012 with witnesses present.
- Applicants are placed in the Cambridge Program by lottery order until all vacancies are filled.
- Once enrollment is met, remaining students are placed on the wait list in lottery order.
 - Students are not issued a new number
 - No additional lottery is run
- Once a student transfers or declines enrollment, the wait list of the current year is activated.
- Students are called *in lottery order only* using the original lottery number as *no new numbers* are generated.
- Once a student accepts placement at a choice school or program, the student's name is removed from all wait lists.
