To qualify for the AICE Diploma, students must earn six credits worth of examinations within a thirteen month period. At least one examination must come from each of the three subject groups: *Mathematics & Science, Languages, Arts & Humanities*. An AS Level exam counts for one credit towards the AICE Diploma; the A Level exam counts for two credits. Test scores must be at the *Pass, Merit, or Distinction* level.
