- a) **The essay should be headed with your name, the title: "High School and Beyond Plan", and the date. It should include the following information:**
- Your career cluster or career of choice
 - The postsecondary education or training you will need to pursue this career
 - The courses you took during high school to prepare for your chosen career.
 - The career exploration activities you completed during high school to prepare for your career, including research done on the subject, job or job shadow experiences, internships, interviews with professionals in the field, culminating project, and volunteer service.
 - The steps you've taken during junior and senior year to prepare for and apply for your top postsecondary choices (tests, college visits, apprenticeship interviews, college presentations, etc.).
 - The plan you've made to finance the next several years of your life
 - Your backup plan, in case plan A doesn't work out.
- b) **On a separate page attach an updated resume. If you do not currently have a resume (new students), please see Mrs. Johnson in the CRC for guidelines.**

3. Counselors will collect your High School and Beyond Plan the week before Spring Break (March 22-26) in your English classes.

4. HS&B Plan document organization

Your final document should include the following components. Everything should be **typed, neat, and stapled**.

- 1st page – High School and Beyond - 13th Year Plan form (first page of this packet)
- 2nd page – Essay, typed
- 3rd page – Updated resume
- 4th page and beyond – Supporting documentation

- ❖ **The High School and Beyond Plan is a State graduation requirement. Students who do not complete a proficient High School and Beyond Plan will earn No Credit (NC) in English class until this graduation requirement is fulfilled.**

PUTTING A PLAN TOGETHER

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Plans for the future for students not pursuing a post-secondary education right away (seeking employment, traveling, volunteering, etc.)

Your immediate post-secondary plans may include seeking employment, traveling, volunteering, etc., but in the long run you will need some form of training or education to advance your career.

TO INVEST IN THE FUTURE

Fifty years ago, you could do without college: 80% of jobs in the U.S. required only a high school education or less. Today, however, only 15% of jobs are open to those without some level of postsecondary education. And 70% of the fastest growing occupations require postsecondary education, meaning that advanced training will be even more important in the future.

TO EARN A GOOD LIVING

According to the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), the income you will earn over the course of your career is directly tied to the level of education you obtain. In 2006, the BLS identified the following average salaries:

High School \$30,000

Associate Degree \$36,000

Bachelor's Degree \$49,000

Master's Degree \$59,000

Doctorate Degree \$74,000

TO FOLLOW YOUR DREAMS

Yes, you need postsecondary education, but what if you don't know exactly what you want to do? Consider attending one of the 34 community or technical colleges in Washington State. You can get a start on your dreams and then move on to a four-year college if you need additional education.
