**ASB CARD** - All students participating in athletics or school sponsored activities are required to purchase an ASB card. The ASB card entitles the student to the following:

1. Free admittance to all home games
2. Discounted tickets at away Kingco games
3. Discounted tickets to school plays, concerts and most dances

**STUDENT EMERGENCY**– On the first day of school each student will receive a Student Emergency/Release of Information Form. These are pre-printed with the information we currently have for your family in our system. Please update the info if needed. All forms should be returned no later than September 12<sup>th</sup>. **To assist in contacting parents/guardians in the case of an emergency, it is very important that every family return this form.**

**LOCKERS** - Locker assignments and combinations will be distributed during Prep Day. For those who do not attend Prep Day, locker assignments and combinations will be distributed in the commons area on the first day of school.

### **CELL PHONE POLICY**

Cell phones disrupt the learning environment, distract the individual who is using the phone and often those around him/her. Cell phones therefore should be in the "off" mode during class periods. They should not be visible or used during class periods. **This includes texting.** A student who does not abide by this policy is subject to the following consequence:

- ❖ The cell phone will be collected and given to an administrator. The student's parent must pick up the phone from the office.

### **ATHLETIC ELIGIBILITY**

The first day of football practice is Wednesday, August 17<sup>th</sup>, all other fall sports begin Monday, August 22<sup>nd</sup>. You cannot practice with the team until you receive a clearance card from the athletic office. A completed eligibility packet plus the following is needed:

- ASB card (\$40) – paid to bookkeeper.
- Athletic participation fee (\$275) – paid to bookkeeper.
- Physical form/proof of insurance: (yellow) - the physical form must be signed by a physician, not a nurse, and by a parent/guardian. Physicals are good for 2 years from the date of the exam.
- Kingco form (blue)
- Athletic Code form signed by athlete and parent/guardian
- HIPAA release form.
- Sport Specific liability form.
- Grades will be checked in athletic office at the time of clearance.

All forms are available in the main office, in the JHS athletic office, and on the JHS website. The athletic office will be open daily starting Monday, August 15<sup>th</sup> from 7 am – 11 am and from noon until 3 pm. For more athletic information, call the Juanita sports hotline at (425) 936-1668.

9<sup>th</sup> graders may turn out for girls swimming, girls soccer, boys & girls cross country and boys golf.

All of these forms need to be submitted together and in person to the athletic office beginning Monday, August 15<sup>th</sup>. Please plan ahead. Get cleared early! Waiting until the first day of practice may result in long lines and the possibility of missing practice!

### **ATTENDANCE**

The attendance policy for the 2011-2012 school year remains the same as the policy for the past several years: At the tenth absence, **whether excused or unexcused**, the student loses credit in the class. *Students who arrive more than 5 minutes after the bell rings are considered absent for the period.* In addition, students who do not attend class and are not excused by a parent or school official are considered truant and will be sanctioned accordingly. **Also, on a student's fifth tardy in any given class and on every additional tardy, an absence will be counted towards his/her total number of absences for that class.** It is the teacher's responsibility to keep accurate attendance records for the class, but it is each student's responsibility to verify and if need be, correct with the teacher his/her own attendance record.

Parents should call or e-mail the Attendance Office (425) 936-1607; [cmcguire@lwsd.org](mailto:cmcguire@lwsd.org) ) to excuse absences **within 48 hours of the beginning of the absence**. Calls can be placed to the Attendance Office 24 hours/day. Please refer to the Student/Parent Handbook for a detailed explanation of the policy. The Handbook will be given to each student at the beginning of the school year. It contains the attendance policy, discipline policy, time schedules, and other information relevant and useful to students and parents. Should there be a question regarding your student's attendance record, the parent/guardian may call the Attendance Office between 7:30 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.

### **COUNSELING**

The counselors return Friday, August 26<sup>th</sup> to assist new families. You may call directly to the Counseling Office at 425-936-1610 to make an appointment. Appointments are required for all counseling meetings. Students who have "Go to Counselor" on their schedule will have the opportunity to see their counselor the first week of school.

## CAREER CENTER

The Career Center page of the JHS website contains information that may provide assistance in finding the right college, exploring career options, and applying for scholarships.

Please check the schedule for visiting college representatives who will be making presentations in the CRC. Students sign up in the CRC to attend the presentations.

The CRC also posts part time jobs and offers resource materials such as books and software describing career choices. These are available for students to check out.

LATE ARRIVAL/EARLY DISMISSAL - Only Seniors are eligible for late arrival or early dismissal. Seniors turning out for any interscholastic sport or cheerleading may not have early dismissal during the semester in which they participate. They also must have a sufficient amount of credits to graduate and have no waivers. If you wish to schedule either late arrival or early dismissal, please call the Counseling Office at (425) 936-1610 to schedule an appointment for a schedule change prior to the first day of school.

HONOR SOCIETY - All students with a 3.50 cumulative GPA who are interested in community service are invited to attend Honor Society's informational meeting at 7:20 AM on Thursday, September 15<sup>th</sup> in the cafeteria. Applications for 2011-2012 membership are available in Room 180 and must be submitted no later than 2:30 PM on Friday, September 23<sup>rd</sup>. We look forward to seeing you! For more information, see the Honor Society window in Room 180.

SCHOOL LUNCH - Student lunches are \$2.75 (subject to change). Students can purchase lunch on a debit system by depositing lunch money with the school bookkeeper; the student's ID card then serves as the debit card. Students who leave campus for lunch must show their off-campus pass and ID card to the parking lot attendant prior to leaving.

MESSAGES AND GIFTS FOR STUDENTS - It is our school policy to not interrupt classes for personal messages for students. **Please limit these messages to emergencies only. Gifts such as balloons and flowers will not be delivered to students.** Balloons and flowers are not appropriate in class, as they can be a disruption to the educational process. Please assist us by discouraging your student from bringing gifts for friends during school.

NON-SCHOOL SPONSORED FLYER/INFORMATION DISTRIBUTION - A variety of information comes to the school district with the request that it be distributed through the schools. If the material is perceived as appropriate for families and is a service or event that would be of interest to families, approval of distribution is given by the District Public Information Office. NOTE: Unless otherwise indicated, the district does not sponsor or guarantee any of the information in these materials. Parents and guardians must review the information and decide on its appropriateness for their family as an individual decision.

OFF-CAMPUS LUNCH PASSES - Only Juniors and Seniors may apply for this privilege; Sophomores are not eligible for off-campus passes. Applications for off-campus passes will be available during Prep Day and in the Attendance Office after Prep Day. Off-Campus Lunch Passes are a privilege and can be revoked or suspended for due cause at any time.

ELECTRONIC PROGRESS REPORTS – The principal will send a group email to parents asking them to log onto parent access to check student grades.

SCHOOL PICTURES – Pictures are taken on Prep Day. The prices are listed in the photo flyer. Make checks out to *Lifetouch* for the correct amount. **All** students (including seniors) will have their pictures taken; these pictures will be this year's ID. **Senior portraits** for the yearbook are due to the yearbook staff by **October 21<sup>st</sup>**. For more information on turning these in see "Yearbook Senior Picture Info". If no picture is submitted, the *Lifetouch* photo will be used.

**STUDENT INSURANCE** – Student Accident & Health Insurance information is enclosed; more forms may be obtained from the Attendance/Athletic Office. For more information, call 425-936-1605.

### **TRANSPORTATION**

**Bus Information** - Students who live more than two miles from Juanita High School are eligible to ride the school bus. Students who attend Juanita High School on a variance status must provide their own transportation and are not issued a parking permit free of charge based on that variance. Please call Transportation at 425-936-1120 for bus information.

**STUDENT PARKING** - Juniors and Seniors are eligible for parking permits. **All parking is assigned – there is NO free or open parking.** Those who want to park a car on campus in the fall (including WaNic and Running Start students), must complete and bring the parking registration form, the required photocopies of their license, registration & proof of insurance, and pay the \$70 fee (\$35 for motorcycles) on their assigned registration day. Copies of the registration and proof of insurance are required for each car on the registration form. The office is unable to make copies for students. Parking spots will be assigned on a first come/first serve basis. Incomplete forms will not be accepted and there will be no “holding” of spots. If you have questions about parking, please contact Mrs. McGrath in the Main Office or Jeff Lewis, school security.

**TRAFFIC** – Traffic congestion can be reduced if we plan ahead and work cooperatively. The circle in front of the school is a **legal traffic circle, all cars MUST travel counterclockwise around the circle.** When dropping off students please use the striped, loading zone in front of the pool. **Please do not park or stop your car in the circle, as this is a no parking fire zone.** Students with a valid parking permit should be parked by 7:30 a.m. Buses arrive with students at approximately 7:30 a.m. Due to parking restrictions, no parking is allowed on 103rd, 109th, 110th, 111th, NE 128th east to 113th, or where otherwise posted. To avoid further restrictions beyond these areas, it is critical that we respect our neighbors and their property. Your cooperation and support are greatly appreciated.

**STUDENT / PARENT HANDBOOK** - Students receive a copy of the Student/Parent Handbook at the beginning of each school year; included in the information are the discipline and attendance codes. First Semester 2011-2012

Welcome to the 2011-2012 school year! The Counseling Department is eager to begin working with Juanita High School students once again. Mrs. Bainter, Ms. Bergman and Mr. Peretti look forward to working with their assigned students. Please notice, due to the addition of the Cambridge Program to JHS, there has been a **shift in alphabetical assignments**.

This memo is to inform you about the schedule process at Juanita High School. **Final class schedules for all students will be available on the first day of classes:** September 6 for sophomores and September 7 for juniors and seniors.

When classes start, the counselors' first priority will be to complete schedules that currently are incomplete for first semester. An incomplete schedule is designated by a "**Go to Counselor**" message in place of a class assignment. Students with "Go to Counselor" messages on their schedules should report to the Counseling Office during the period(s) for which they have that message. Counselors will assist students in completing their schedules.

**Schedule Change Requests/Academic Reasons:**

The Counseling Office will accept **Schedule Change Request Forms** from students who have academic reasons for schedule changes. These include:

- Placed in an inappropriate course level.
- Placed in a course not requested during registration.
- Must add a senior year course needed to fulfill a graduation requirement.
- Must add a course needed to fulfill the Level 5 Formal Lab Report requirement.

## Schedule Change Requests/Process

Student requests for changes are considered only during the Drop/Add Period: September 7 -September 14, 2011.

To request a change, a student must do all of the following:

1. Complete the **Schedule Change Request Form**.
2. Secure appropriate signatures from teachers and parents.
3. Submit the Form to the Counseling Office.
4. **Check in the Counseling Office the next day to learn the results of the request.**  
The result of the request will be recorded on the Form. All Forms submitted will be fully processed, even if the requested change cannot be made.

The counselors will seek to serve every student fully and fairly through the Drop/Add Period. **We are greatly assisted in this process if we do not receive e-mail or telephone requests for schedule changes.** Request Forms will be processed in the order they are received in the Counseling Office.

### Summary of Guidelines and Deadlines:

- **Schedule Change Request Forms available beginning September 7, 2011.**
- **Student Schedule Change Request deadline: September 14, 2011.**
- **Last day to request Pass/Fail grading option: October 5, 2011.**
- **Fees are charged for textbooks not returned when a course is dropped.**
- **New Class Report Date appears on the processed Schedule Change Request Form.**

**A grade of F will be assigned for any class dropped after the tenth day of the semester (September 21, 2011).**

### Grades from online classes:

Students that have been approved to enroll in an online class during the summer should contact their counselor to schedule the proctoring of the final exam in September, and request that a transcript be mailed to the counselor after final grades are posted.

**IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING ATTENDANCE  
AND MEDICAL CARE  
2011/2012**

**ATTENDANCE**

All absences should be called in to the attendance line at 425-936-1607 or e-mailed to [rmcguire@lwsd.org](mailto:rmcguire@lwsd.org) within 48 hours of any absence. When leaving a message, please spell the student's last name and leave your name and call back number. **Any absence called in after 48 hours will not be excused and the information will be filed in the student's attendance folder.** When a student comes in late they need to sign in at the attendance office and receive a pass to class. The absence will remain unexcused until we receive a note or phone call from the parent/guardian. The acceptable reasons for excused absences in the Lake Washington School District are:

- Personal injury or illness
- Pre-arranged absence
- Family emergency (bereavement, etc.)
- Medical appointments
- Religious holidays

When your student has an appointment, please notify the attendance office prior to his/her leaving. Hand written notes and questionable phone calls may be verified with a phone call to the parent/guardian. The absence will be considered unexcused until we receive verification from the parent/guardian.

**MEDICAL CARE**

Juanita High School does not have a full time nurse on staff. Staff at the school will not provide non-emergency medical care, however we will provide routine first aid on an as needed basis. If a student is ill they should come to the attendance office and a decision will be made regarding whether the student should be excused to go home. Students who do not go home will be able to rest in the attendance office for up to 20 minutes, after which they will be sent back to class. We encourage you to keep your student home when he/she is ill.

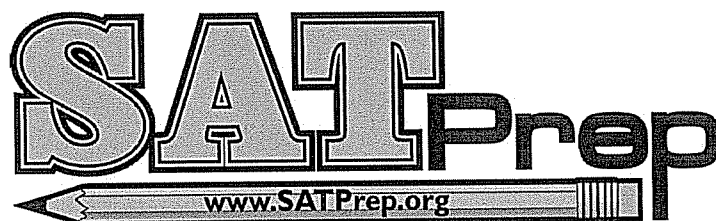

## Lake Washington High Schools 2011 - 2012

For 2011-2012, the SAT's are offered Oct. 1, Nov. 5, Dec. 3, Jan. 28, March 10, May 5, and June 2.
