



# 2021-22 School Goals


- Grades 6-8 English Language Arts (ELA): 6th graders will score 3% higher than • previous class scored last year 84% of 7th graders at standard 91% of 8th graders at standard
- Grades 6-8 Math: 6th graders will score 3% higher than previous class scored last year 80% of  $7^{th}$  graders at standard 85% of 8<sup>th</sup> graders at standard
- Grade 8 Science: 90% of students at WCAS standard ٠
- Achievement gap: 6th grade math students currently at level 1 or 2 will move to a level of proficiency
- College & Career Readiness: All RSAR students will participate in the District's • College & Career Readiness program
- School Effectiveness: Develop lessons which use the principles as defined in the book Habits of Mind, 16 Essential Characteristics for Success and engage students in practicing these skills
- Discipline SMART Goal: Develop a procedure for tracking disciplinary infractions. RSAR teachers will develop, along with the school counselor, a self-reflection sheet for students to fill out when discipline steps are needed.
