2021-22 School Goals

The Mark Twain staff is committed to continued student growth. Collaborative conversations among staff members have helped teams reflect on learning standards and student needs.


- Grades K-2 Reading: 87% of students at standard on the end of year Fastbridge
- Grades 3-5 English Language Arts: 80% at standard
- Grades 3-5 Math: 71% at standard
- Grade 5 Science: 75% at standard
- Achievement gap: 25% of ELL students should reach English proficiency by the end of the year
- School Effectiveness: Increase the percentage of staff who agree with the statement: "Staff members will connect with each other outside of grade level teams" from 71% to 80%. This goal will also reflect vertical articulation as well.
- Attendance: Our 2021-22 goal is to continue to meet our 97% daily attendance rate as in previous year but to decrease the number of tardy to school through education, communication and rewarding those classes that demonstrate the least daily tardiness over the month
- Discipline: Reduce office referrals by 10% from previous year by implementing restorative conversations between students, along with continued training for staff on de-escalation and supervision strategies.


2021-22 District Expenditures

Where does the money go?




State Assessment Results
