- March 10, 2022 Notification to families
- March 21, 2022 Acceptance deadline

# How do we compare to other schools in the district?

#### **Discovery Community School**

- Smaller school only three teachers
- Multi-age classrooms
- Learning journeys (approximately 1 per month)
- Parent involvement; 65 hours Per family, per year with classroom assistance strongly encouraged

#### **District Wide**

- Class sizes very similar
- LWSD curriculum:
  - Language arts
  - Science
  - Math
  - Social studies
- Specialists:
  - Music
  - Library
  - Physical education
- Conferences & report cards



What if my child qualifies for extra services (IEP, 504, ML, Highly Capable) DCS students receive all legal accommodations and supports. They will attend all Safety Net, Multi-Lingual, Highly Capable, and Quest groups they qualify for.



Are your teaching styles/philosophies different from the other schools? Founding principles for DCS are now quite common across our district and other schools in general.


