Our goal is to provide a comprehensive education that challenges and motivates every child to learn and grow. Our support staff, PTSA, our parents and community groups are critical partners.



#### 2021-22 School Goals


Rose Hill staff is committed to deepening their understanding of reading and math curriculum along with state standards by working in collaboration with grade level teammates and specialists.

- Grades K-2 Reading: 89% 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade Safety Net and/or EL students will meet benchmark on end of year DIBELS
- Grades 3-5 English Language Arts: 73% at standard
- Grades 3-5 Math: 70% at standard
- Grade 5 science: 75% at standard
- Achievement gap: 48% of 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade Safety Net and/or EL students will meet benchmark on end of year DIBELS
- School Effectiveness: Regarding the statement "The staff works across grade level teams to help increase student learning.," increase the percentages:
   From 60 to 75% of staff who Agree or Mostly Agree
- Attendance: We will reduce by 40% the number of students who have 15+ absences in a year from 27 to 17 students in the 18-19 school year.
- Discipline: We will reduce the amount of Think It Over forms (office referrals); this year focusing on monthly tracking analyzing the following: type of behavior, grade level, location and gender from 10 to 7.




3rd Grade English Language Arts




4th Grade English Language Arts




5th Grade English Language Arts




3rd Grade Math



4th Grade Math


