School Description


Inglewood Middle School is a school of excellence located on the Sammamish Plateau. Inglewood serves a student body of approximately 1200 students. The Inglewood community values connections, we act with integrity, and practice self-awareness. There are many opportunities to get involved and connect with peers. As a fully inclusive school, Inglewood heterogeneously groups students and then differentiates instruction to meet the needs of all students. We closely monitor the academic progress of all students. When a student begins to struggle to meet learning objectives, we intervene immediately in a friendly, supportive, and systematic way.

Inglewood offers an intensive academic and extra-curricular program. Language Arts and Social Studies classes are taught by the same teacher in a two-hour period, commonly called a "block class," at all grade levels.


- Grades 6-8 English Language Arts (ELA): 90% of students at standard


