Barbara Posthumus, Associate Superintendent, Business and Support Services, presented Resolution No. 2259 for first reading. She provided an overview of funding for construction projects in the district from 2015-18 and the long-term facility funding plan. The October 1, 2018 enrollment for the district was 29,987. Enrollment has increased 26% since 2008; 11 straight years of enrollment growth, approximately 620 students per year which is the size of an elementary school for each year. The district has 181 portables, 14% of the classrooms in the district, an equivalent of six large elementary schools. She showed the capacity needed in each of the learning communities.

Ms. Posthumus continued and highlighted the efforts to develop a levy plan – six board study sessions were held between March – November and the Levy Advisory Committee was convened in October 2018. She then presented the recommendation for funding to address critical capacity needs – critical projects for growth and safety and core facilities.

RESOLUTION NO. 2259

Resolution No. 2259, Capital Projects Levy, authorizes a sixyear levy totaling \$120 million or an average of \$20 million per year for six years. Levy funds would pay for critical projects to address rapid enrollment growth and student safety and security. Proposed projects include: classroom additions at Lake Washington High School, including auxiliary gyms and commons; classroom additions at Carson Elementary, Franklin Elementary, Rose Hill Elementary, and Twain Elementary, including expansion of core facilities where feasible; and district-wide student safety and security upgrades.

The estimated tax rates per \$1,000 of assessed valuation (AV) for 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023, 2024, and 2025 are \$0.29, \$0.28, \$0.27, \$0.26, \$0.25, \$0.25 respectively. The district currently funds construction projects through prior bond measures. With the addition of a 6-year levy, the tax rate for construction will be maintained at the current rate of \$1.16 of \$1,000 assessed valuation (AV) through the combination of prior bonds and the 6-year capital project levy.

The overall tax rate per \$1,000 of assessed valuation, including this measure and previously approved bond and levy measures is estimated to be \$2.60 in 2019 and is estimated to remain at \$2.60 in 2020 and beyond.

Dr. Stavem and Ms. Posthumus responded to board members questions.

The Board is scheduled to adopt Resolution No. 2259, Capital Projects Levy, at the December 3, 2018 board meeting.

Dr. Stavem emphasized that the district is looking at incredible growth and the Capital Projects Levy is only one piece of the puzzle. The district will continue to look at all possibilities to keep the district moving forward to address facility needs for students.
