On-time order	Exam ordered and paid for between September 1, 2020 and October 30, 2020 (College Board charges \$94 per exam and LWSO adds a \$2 charge per exam to cover administration costs)	\$96
Late order	Exam ordered between February 1 and February 19, 2021 (College Board adds a \$40 per exam late fee and LWSO adds a \$10 per exam late fee)	\$146
Unused/Canceled exam	CollegeBoard has waived all cancellation fees for AP Exams for the 2020-21 school year	\$0 cancellation fee

Important Notes:

1. Late order fees do not apply to AP courses that are single semester AP courses offered in the second semester.
2. Late fees (\$50 per exam for exams ordered after October 30, 2020) apply to all students including students who qualify for reduced fee exams.

Exam Dates:

- The 2020-2021 AP Exam administrations will be administered in May, 2021.

RENT ASSISTANCE

World Language Testing

Due to remote learning, safety and social distancing protocols, and unique transportation needs of families and students, LWSD is offering more flexible testing windows this year for World Language Testing. Testing will be conducted in person in a small group setting following strict safety and social distancing procedures.
