- **Need help applying for Financial Aid for college?** Cascadia College (just a short drive from JHS) will host two drop-in sessions for the 2018-19 financial aid season - Saturday, January 26th from 10:00a-12:00p . Drop-in sessions are open to high school seniors who would like assistance with the FAFSA or WAFSA application. You do not need to sign up to attend the drop-in session. This is a **free** program that helps students and families complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or Washington Application for State Financial Aid (WASFA). You do NOT have to be planning to attend Cascadia to attend this event – it is open to students who plan to go to any college/university.
