## After School Safety:

In order to ensure the safety of all our students and staff on campus we have some basic expectations and procedures for everyone to be aware of.

- The commons closes after school. Students getting snacks and/or beverages have until 2:50 before they need to leave.
- We lock all the exterior doors to the old building at 3:00.
- Access to the fieldhouse is limited to student athletes who are under the supervision of their coaches, or other student groups who have an advisor there to support them in decorating, planning for assemblies,
- Teachers are generally available after school (unless they are in meetings), so students are welcome to make arrangements with their teachers to get help, make up work, etc.

## AP Registration is February 20th to March 6th.

You will receive your AP Registration packets in your AP classes starting February 19th.

Things to remember:

- AP registration is \$96 per test this year. If cost is an issue for you, please see Ms. Potts in 169B. There are fee reductions available for students on free/reduced lunch.
- You can register for up to 7 tests on one envelope.
- Make sure you use the full name of your AP Class – for example, AP Language and Comp. rather than AP English.
- You must register for your AP test by 1:30pm on March 6th. The lines will get long, so save yourself the stress and register early!
- This year there is once again an online option for registration. The directions will be in your registration packets. If you register online, you must print out a copy of your receipt and turn it in to the bookkeeper along with your registration envelope in order to guarantee that your test will be ordered.
