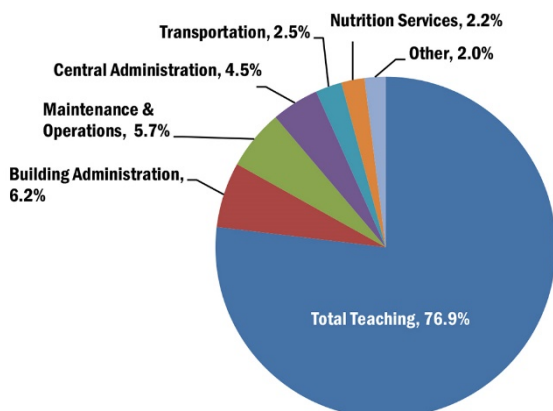
School Description

2017-18 School Goals

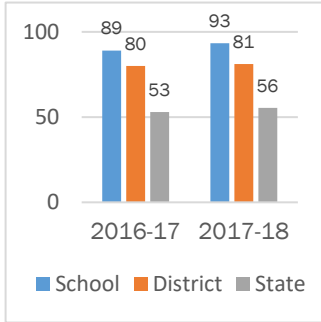
Teachers examined state assessment results to determine school goals. Teachers met to discuss strategies to be used to increase performance. Grade level teams then met to refine strategies, design interventions and create challenge opportunities for students.

- K-2 Reading: 82% of students at standard on the End of Year DIBELS assessment
- Grades 3-5 English Language Arts: 85% of students at standard
- Grades 3-5 Math: 84% of students at standard
- Grade 5 Science: 88% of students at standard
- Achievement Gap: 67% of students listed on the equity grid provided in August 2017 will improve by one or more proficiency levels in either ELA or math as measured by June 2018 state assessment data.
- School Effectiveness: Increase the percentage of staff who “agree mostly/completely” with the statement “Staff works in teams across grade levels to help increase student learning” from 89% to 97%, and for “Teachers provide feedback to each other to help improve instructional practices” from 97% to 100%.
- Attendance: Improvement from 8.3% of students having a 10% or greater absence rate to 3.3% of students having a 10% or greater absence rate as measured by June 2018 attendance information.
- Discipline: Improvement from 145 communication slips being handed out to students during the school year to 110.

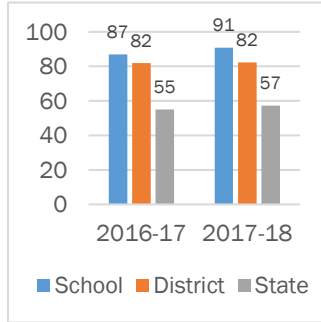

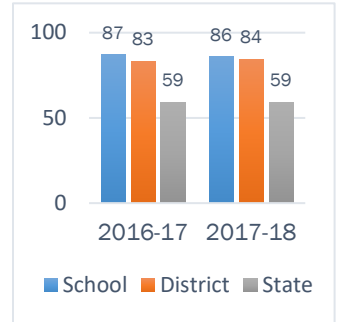
3rd Grade English Language Arts



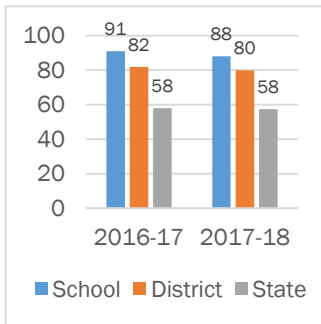
4th Grade English Language Arts



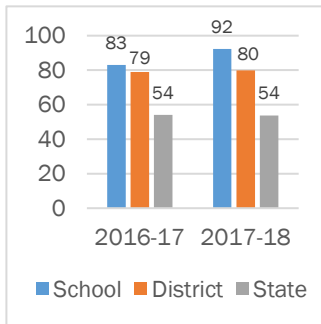
5th Grade English Language Arts



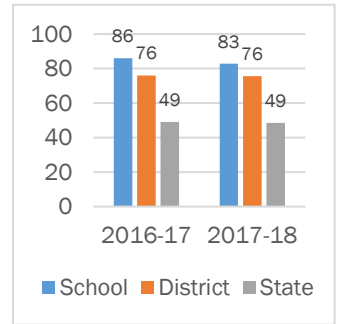
3rd Grade Math



4th Grade Math

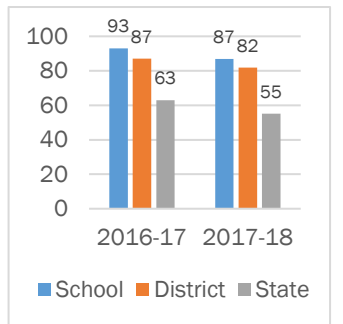


5th Grade Math

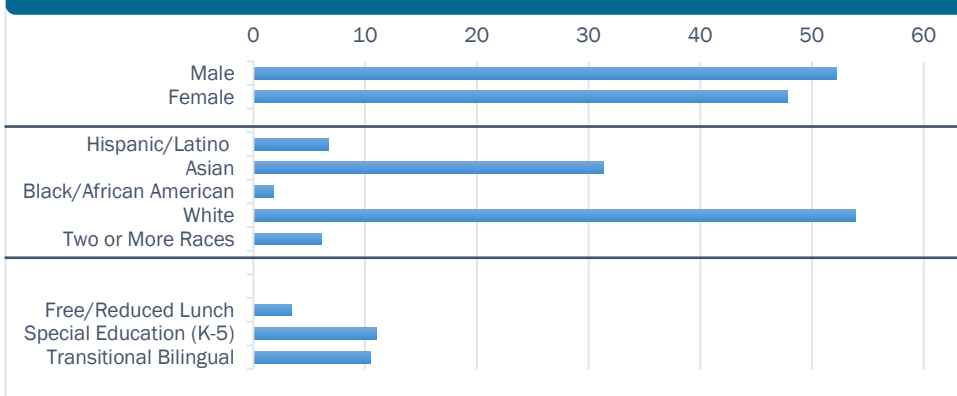
