January Conferences

Kindergarten Registration

It will soon be time to begin Kindergarten registration for the 2021-22 school year.

The initial registration period for children who will be five years old on or before August 31st will begin on February 18, 2021 and extend through March 1, 2021. Registration for all K-12 LWSD students will be available online at the link below. Families who prefer an alternative to online registration will be able to pick up hard-copy registration packets at the school office beginning February 18th.

Online Registration:

All necessary registration documents can be accessed on the LWSD website and uploaded securely. Parents who are unable to upload documents may send them to the school by U.S. mail or contact the school to arrange a safe drop off.

Hard Copy Registration (Packets):

All necessary registration documents will be included in the packets provided. Completed packets can be returned to the school office. The school office can also make copies of personal documents, as needed (ex: Birth Certificates, Immunization Papers, Proof of Residency, etc.).

*Important: While K-12 student registration will continue throughout the school year and summer, **parents are highly encouraged to register students as soon as possible.** Doing so helps LWSD to ensure that class sizes are balanced and adequate staff are hired in time for the new school year.*

Student Picture Day

We are excited to announce that student pictures will be taken on February 23rd and February 24th. Families will be able to reserve their time online so they can have their child's picture taken in a socially distanced and safe manner. Stay tuned for more information on safety protocols, picture reservations, and order forms.

Supply/Library Book Distribution: Closed January 4 - 15

As a reminder, we will not have materials carts or library book distribution available the two weeks following winter break (January 4 – 15). We will resume our materials carts process on Tuesday, January 19th. We hope this will help ensure the safety of our students, families, and staff.

Weather Events & Internet/Service Outages – What to Expect

Pacific Northwest weather can be unpredictable. As a result, it is important that we provide families with information on what to expect when a weather event or power outage takes place during the school day.

Power and Internet Outages:

If a student or teacher experiences a power or internet outage:

- Students should contact their teacher or the school to report the power/internet outage (email is fine). They should rejoin class instruction when the outage is over and internet connection is available. Students will not be marked absent in these situations.
- If the teacher is suddenly absent from a Teams meeting due to a power/internet outage they should leave the session and re-enter after 15 minutes. If the teacher is still absent from the Teams meeting after 15 minutes students may end the class.
- The school/teacher will contact families via email in the case of a teacher-related power/internet outage, directing them to work on asynchronous activities and/or previously assigned work.

Weather Events (Snow Days):

Snow days during remote learning will work differently than a normal school year. If snow or inclement weather affects a school day, remote instruction will continue. Students who receive in-person services/instruction at the school site will shift to remote learning for that day. There will be no late starts to the school day and no extension to the school year due to snow or weather-related events.

Announcements will be made to staff and families via our School Messenger system (by phone, email, and by text messaging for those signed up), district website posting, and social media postings. The district will also use FlashAlert.net, which reports directly to local media and provides text alerts to anyone who signs up.
