### **Computer and Text Book Return Process**

Some families have asked what the process will be to return computers and text books at the end of the year. The district is currently working on this and should have information to share with parents in the coming weeks. At this time parents can expect to return items in the middle of June, prior to school ending. Please be on the lookout for more information on this topic in future newsletters.

### **New Student and Kindergarten Registration**

Families may have noticed the topic of "Student Registration" being a regular reminder in our weekly Principal Updates. This is because enrollment numbers are down at our school and across the district.

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There are many reasons why enrollment is down. Some families may be waiting to see what school will look like next year. Others may have committed to a private school option this year due to LWSD beginning the year in a remote setting. Some families may be considering a home school option next year due to concerns about our expected return to full in-person learning. Families with younger students may be contemplating having their student participate in another year of preschool. The reality is that our decline in enrollment is most likely a combination of each of these factors.

As families consider whether or not to enroll their child for in-person learning next year I want to reiterate our commitment to providing a safe, inclusive, and challenging learning environment for all students. Students have been at McAuliffe in-person, on campus, in some form or another all year without any COVID incidences occurring at our school. We are taking every precaution possible to ensure the safety of our students, while at the same time providing an in-person learning experience. The return to in-person learning has been a success!

As we look to next year, we are planning on starting the year in-person for all students. As we plan for next year it is my hope to retain our excellent staff and have lower class sizes for our students. This can be accomplished by having all eligible students enrolled prior to the end of May.

I would encourage families to register their student, even as they wait for more information to come from the district. This will help ensure our staffing numbers are accurate, which impacts students in terms of class sizes and teacher assignments. **At this time our staff will be reduced by two teachers next year.** That being said, we are close to adding staff in a number of grades – all we need is more students! If you have neighbors or friends who have not yet registered their child, please remind them to do so.

All necessary registration documents can be accessed on the LWSD website and uploaded securely. Parents who are unable to upload documents may send them to the school by U.S. mail or contact the school to arrange a safe drop off.
