### SAT and ACT

The mean SAT scores for 2016-17 were:

Our students who sat for SAT Subject Test exams in the 2016-17 school year had above average scores. Means for SAT Subject Tests included:

The average ACT composite score for the same period was 26.3. Redmond High School's averages are well above the district, state and national averages.

Redmond High School is located in a northeastern suburb of Seattle, Washington and is one of four comprehensive high schools in the Lake Washington School District, encompassing suburbs of Redmond, Kirkland, Sammamish, and Juanita. One of the fastest growing areas in the state, Redmond is largely a middle to upper class community, formerly an agricultural and timber area, but now associated with rapidly expanding high-tech development.

Redmond High School is a four-year high school with an approximate total enrollment of 1,900 students. A class size limit of 32 exists for most class sections.

The mission of Redmond High School is to provide an appropriately challenging academic experience for each individual, a school environment which values the contributions and aptitudes of each individual, and a system of advocacy and instruction which connects each individual to the greater community and the opportunities waiting there.

## Advanced Placement (AP)

Redmond High School offers 19 Advanced Placement classes. Students may enroll in as many AP classes as their high school schedule will accommodate. While most AP classes are offered every year, several others (such as AP Art History and AP European History) are typically offered every other year. In 2017, RHS students took 951 tests in 23 subject areas with 87% earning a grade of 3 or higher. The average score for the school on AP exams was 3.71. In addition, RHS had 61 AP Scholars, 34 AP Scholars with Honors, 96 AP Scholars with Distinction and 32 National AP Scholars.

Students are allowed to access staff as mentors to self-study for AP classes not offered in the regular curriculum.



## Graduation Requirements

Students must have a minimum of 22 credits, which must include the following required courses for the class of 2018:

Graduates must also meet standard on Washington State Assessment Requirements.

One-half credit is granted for satisfactory completion of each course that meets three periods per week for 55 minutes per period and one period per week for 85 minutes, for 18 weeks. A passing grade is a "D".

### Rank In Class

All students, regardless of the type of classes taken and/or the number of credits earned, are included in the class rank. All courses that receive a letter grade are used to determine class rank. Class ranking is computed semi-annually and cumulatively. Grades point averages and class ranks are not weighted.
