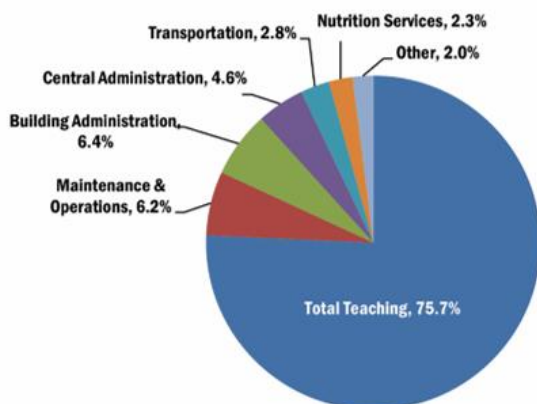
## School Description

## 2016-17 School Goals

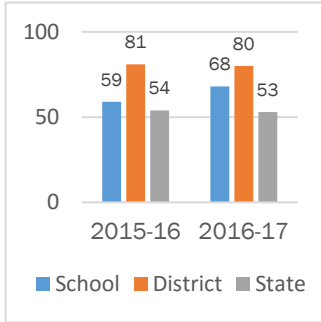
Grade level teams met to determine student growth goals and state test target scores. Staff analyzed last year's assessment data and individual student assessment data to determine assessment goals.

- Grades K-2 Reading: 90% of students at benchmark on end of year DIBELS
- Grades 3-5 English Language Arts: 70% at standard
- Grades 3-5 Math: 63% at standard
- Grade 5 science: 75% at standard
- Achievement gap: 25% of our Limited English students will be at benchmark in ELA as measured by the SBA
- School Effectiveness: Percentage of staff who report that the school successfully keeps unruly behavior to a minimum will increase from 55% to 65%.
- Attendance: Number of students reporting to school tardy will be reduced by 10%
- Discipline: Number of discipline referrals will decrease to 2 per day on average

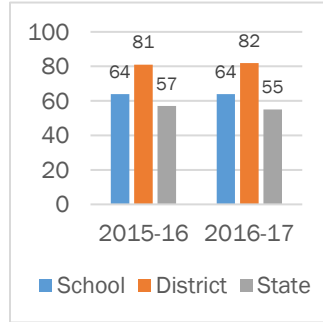

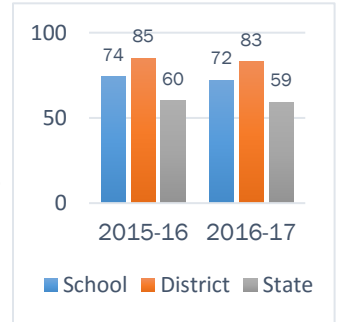
**3rd Grade English Language Arts**



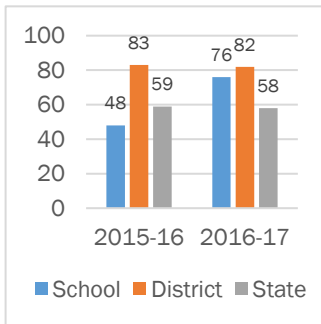
**4th Grade English Language Arts**



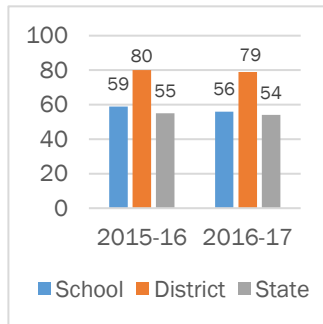
**5th Grade English Language Arts**



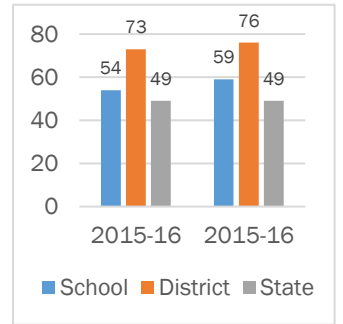
**3rd Grade Math**



**4th Grade Math**

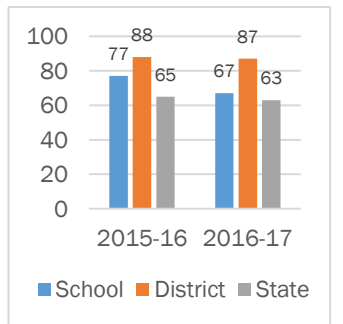

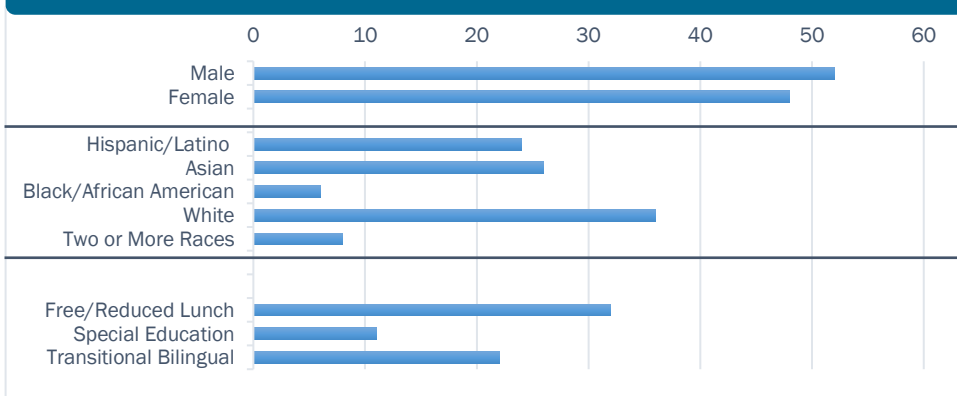
