## School Description

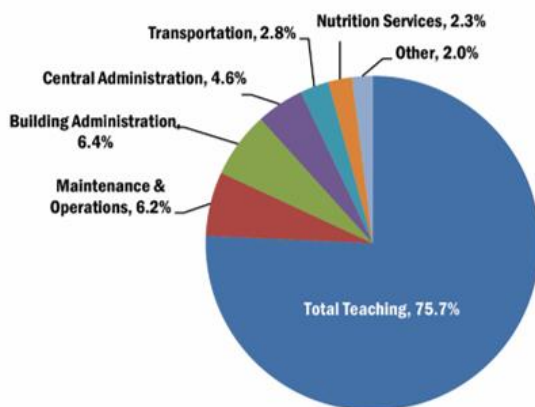
Helen Keller Elementary School, located in Kirkland, Wash., is a K-5 school with an enrollment of 370 students. Keller is located in the Juanita region, in a well-established residential neighborhood.

With our mission in mind, we provide an excellent instructional program for a diverse community of students. We have approximately 50 students who receive support through our English Language Learner and intensive academic support programs and we house two Learning Centers, serving district students in grades K-5 with developmental needs. Keller students have done well on state testing, over the years making steady gains.

Helen Keller Elementary School has a strong, involved community with many parents and neighbors. The school has become a community hub thanks to staff and volunteers.

## 2016-17 School Goals

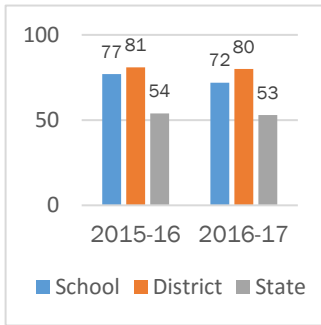
The process used to determine annual school goals includes an in-depth building-wide analysis. Teachers set grade level goals in both reading and math and 5<sup>th</sup> grade science.

- K-2 Reading: 93% at benchmark on end of year DIBELS
- Grades 3-5 English Language Arts: 72% at standard
- Grades 3-5 Math: 75% at standard
- Grade 5 science: 73% at standard
- Achievement gap: 50% of grades 3-5 ELL students at standard in all areas on SBA.
- School effectiveness: 75% of teachers agree mostly or completely that "teachers provide feedback to each other to help improve instructional practices"
- Attendance: Reduce the average number of students tardy per day from 10 to 5
- Discipline: Reduce the average number of students receiving Notice Notes (internal communication of student misbehavior) from 46 per month to 25 per month.

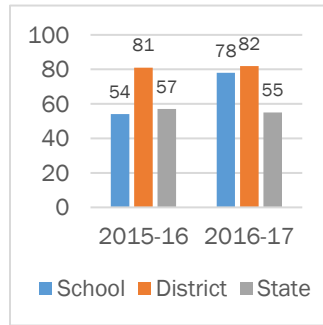

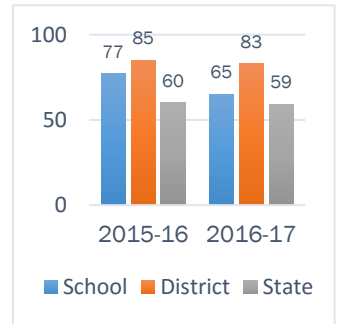
3rd Grade English Language Arts



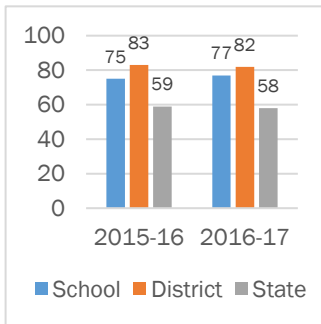
4th Grade English Language Arts



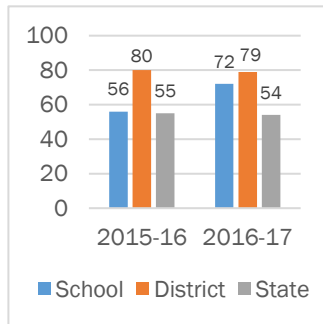
5th Grade English Language Arts



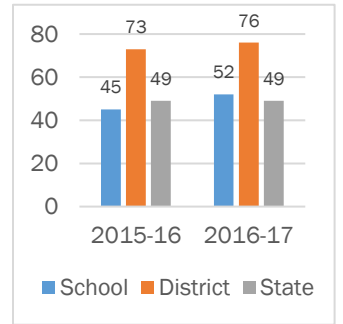
3rd Grade Math



4th Grade Math

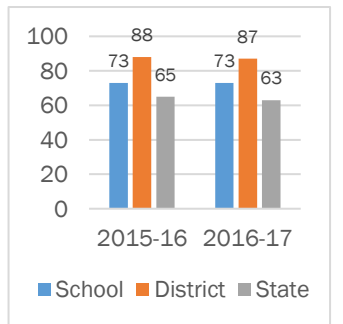


5th Grade Math



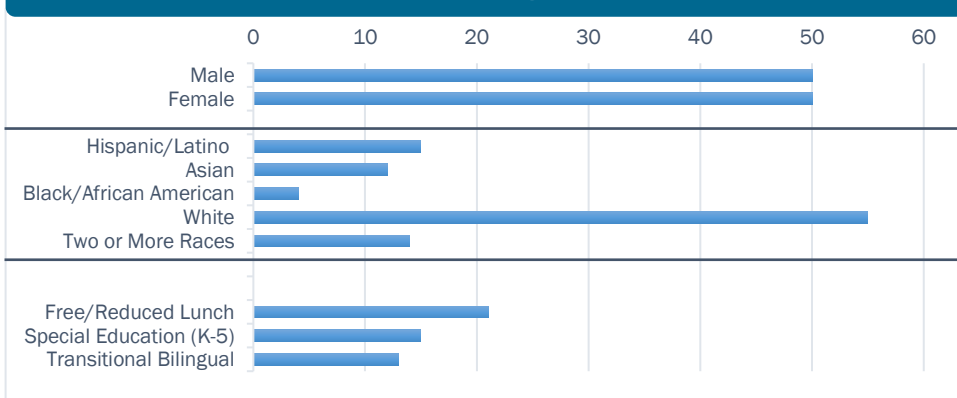
