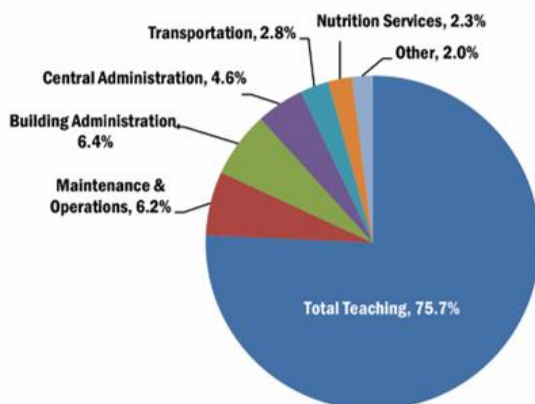
School Description

2016-17 School Goals

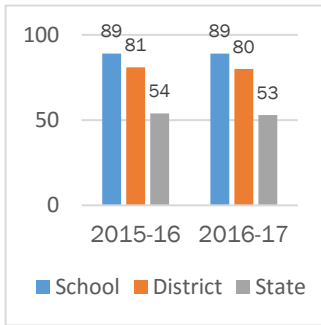
Teachers examined state assessment results to determine school goals. Teachers met to discuss strategies to be used to increase performance. Grade level teams then met to refine strategies, design interventions and create challenge opportunities for students.

- K-2 Reading: 85% of students at standard on the End of Year DIBELS assessment
- Grades 3-5 English Language Arts: 88% of students at standard
- Grades 3-5 Math: 90% of students at standard
- Grade 5 Science: 88% of students at standard
- Achievement Gap: 66% of students in lower math groups (September 2016) in grades 3, 4, and 5 will score at a Level 3 or above as measured by the SBA assessment in May 2017.
- School Effectiveness: Increase the percentage of staff who agree with the statements, "Staff works in teams across grade levels" and "Staff members work together to solve problems".
- Attendance: Improvement from 3.1% of students having a 10% or greater absence rate to 1.5% of students having a 10% or greater absence rate as measured by June 2017 attendance information.
- Discipline: Improvement from 1.0% of students suspended to less than 1.0% as measured by June 2017 suspension data.

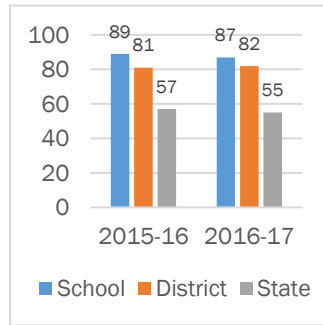

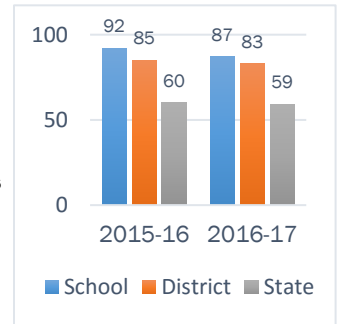
3rd Grade English Language Arts



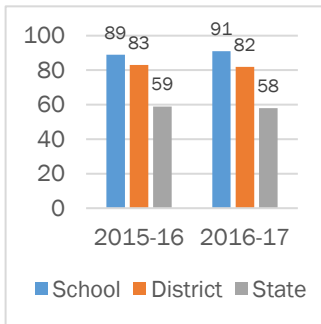
4th Grade English Language Arts



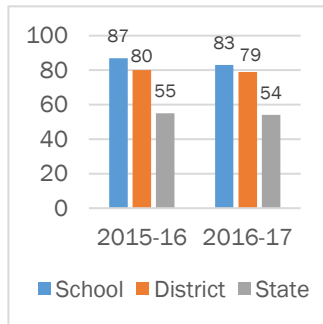
5th Grade English Language Arts



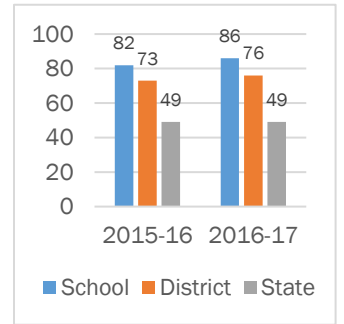
3rd Grade Math



4th Grade Math

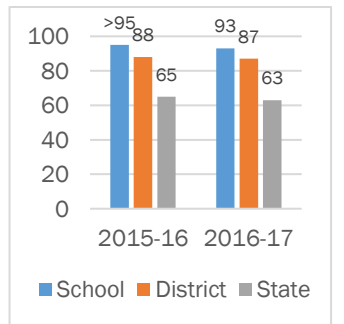


5th Grade Math



Measurements of Student Progress (MSP)

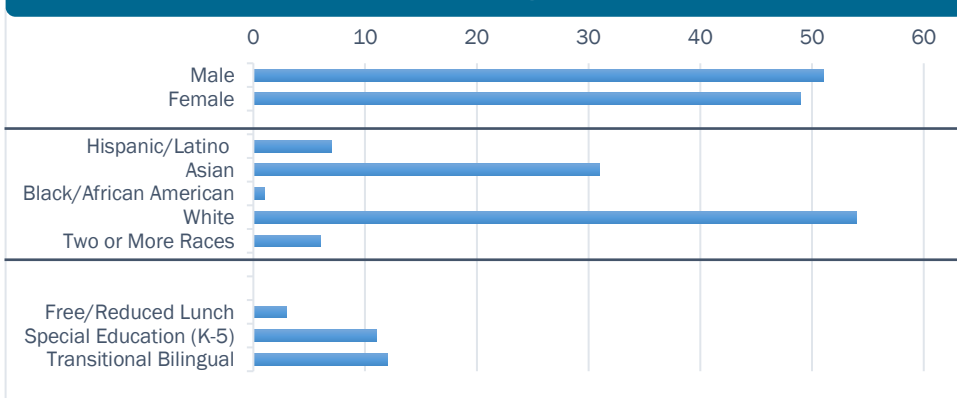
