Elementary Summer School will consist of a 3½ hour instructional day for students. Classes meet Monday through Friday. All classes will cover core content; reading, writing, and math. Each class will be a preparatory class for the next grade level. For example: Pre-2nd will focus on skills for students that just completed first grade and will be entering second grade in fall 2018.

If you want your student to take classes for a grade level above their current grade level, the student's current principal or counselor MUST sign the registration form (page A).

Additionally, each teacher will teach an elective class. Groups of students will experience a variety of fun and engaging classes. Pre-K, Pre-1st, Pre-2nd, and Pre-3rd teachers will work together to provide the elective rotation for their primary group of students. Pre-4th, Pre-5th, and Pre-6th teachers will work together to provide the elective rotation for their intermediate group of students.

Summer Camps

This year, there are three 10-day enrichment opportunities which have been added. They are STEM Camp (coding, robotics, and engineering design), Drama Camp (theater, stage, and performance), and Integrated Art/Writing Experience (multi-medium art with varied writing approaches). There are two sessions for these opportunities:

STEM Camp

Session I: July 6–19 and Session II: July 20 - Aug. 2

This 10-day course is designed for students entering grades 1-5 in the fall 2018. STEM Camp will meet from 8:30 a.m.-noon each day. Participants will explore a variety of STEM-based learning experiences to include the engineering design process, maker spaces and coding.

Drama Camp

Session I: July 6–19

This ten-day course is designed for students entering grades 1-5 in the fall 2018. Drama Camp will meet from 8:30 a.m.-noon each day. Participants will explore foundations of stage performance to include auditions, rehearsals, role/character development, costuming and live stage performance. Drama Camp culminates with a performance for families.

Integrated Art/Writing Workshop Camp

Session II: July 20–Aug. 2

This ten-day course is designed for students entering grades 1-5 in the fall 2018. Integrated Art/Writing Workshop will meet from 8:30 a.m.-noon each day. Participants will create works of art via watercolor, color pencil, charcoal, etc. and then develop creative writing pieces based on their art. Integrated Art/Writing Workshop culminates with the development of a take home anthology.

NEW! Green Sustainable Design–Entering grades 5-7 July 2–13, 2018

8:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.

Provides a hands-on exploration of green and sustainable concepts that are a large part of the working world of the 21st century. Topics explored include defining sustainability, design of green buildings, auditing sustainable workplaces, solar and wind energy production, sustainable transportation, and green ecosystems. Hands-on activities and projects focus on engineering, design, and applications of science.

Reduced Fees

The Lake Washington School District Board of Directors has determined that **current** LWSD resident students who qualify for free or reduced lunch at their home school during the current school year also qualify for reduced Summer School tuition subject to the following guidelines:

1. **Free and reduced forms are NOT available during walk-in or late Summer School registration.**
2. LWSD must verify students' free or reduced lunch status. Please have the student's current school official verify on the registration form prior to submitting it. Or you may contact Sara Peterson sapeterson@lwsd.org if you cannot reach your current school official, and obtain a Free and Reduced form. After submitting the form to sapeterson@lwsd.org, you will receive a verification letter that must be included with your registration form if you are eligible.

Needs Based Scholarship Information

The scholarship request form is for students who reside and attend school within the Lake Washington School District during the regular school year. Scholarships are for summer school applicants with financial need. Fee Refunds

The course fee will be refunded if a course is cancelled. **NO refunds will be approved once Summer School classes have begun (after July 6, 2018).**

Course Cancellations

Summer School is a self-supporting program dependent on student fees. Courses that fail to achieve minimum enrollment may be cancelled or combined. Parents will be notified of cancellations and fees will be refunded as soon as possible, usually in two to four weeks. We will make the final determination for classes, based on enrollment.

The on-site Elementary Summer School Secretary will notify all parents if summer classes are cancelled before the first day of Summer School.

Special Services

Support and accommodations for students with IEPs (Individualized Education Plans) or 504s are provided differently in Summer School. The staff aims to meet the needs of all students; we review current information on your child's IEP or 504 plan to better understand strategies, classroom accommodations, or assignment modifications that allow your child to be successful in a regular classroom environment. Pull-out services for Specially Designed Instruction are not part of the Elementary Summer School program.

Medical Information

Please list on the registration form any important medical information for your child. This might include medical conditions and/or medications the student may need to take during the school day, for example, for allergies, migraines, etc.

An LWSD Medical Authorization Form **MUST** be completed by a doctor before any medications can be given during the school day. Medical authorization forms are available at your home school and **MUST** be turned in with your registration forms. Medication to be given during school hours by a trained staff member must be brought to the Summer School office on the first day of Summer School.

DigiPen Junior Art and Animation

Digital production artists are responsible for producing the amazing visual experiences in today's video games and animations. Success in this field requires artistic passion combined with a solid grasp of both traditional and digital art skills. This workshop lets you explore the world of production art through a variety of animation projects using non-digital and digital media.

Students will learn:

- Traditional fine arts skills
- The art and animation production pipeline
- Basic 2D computer animation, modeling, and texturing
- Storytelling, dialogue, and writing techniques for animation

DigiPen Junior Music and Sound Design

Play your favorite game on mute or watch an animation in silence and you'll quickly realize how important sound and music are when it comes to creating a fun and engaging experience. Through the creation of a variety of musical instruments, students in this workshop study the science of how sounds are made and heard. Students also learn the fundamentals of sound production and are introduced to the basic process of writing and performing their own music.

Students will learn:

- The theory behind sound and how it is heard
- How to construct various instruments
- Basic music and composition theory
- Implementation of sound into games and animations

DigiPen Junior 2D Game Design

In Junior 2D Game Design, your student will learn that game design is much more than a pastime – it is a challenging and fulfilling field that rewards passion, creativity, and hard work. In this workshop, your student will apply concepts from math, physics, art, and logic as they create games in a variety of genres. Each student will have the opportunity to create a capstone project by choosing from the different game genres presented during the first week.

Students will learn:

- The game design process
- Game design mechanics
- Basic programming techniques

DigiPen Junior Worldbuilding

What do Bilbo Baggins, Harry Potter, and Percy Jackson have in common? They are live in complete worlds filled with rich detail about their respective geographies, cultures, economies, and bestiaries. Building these worlds is an essential element of game design, art, writing, and filmmaking. In Junior Worldbuilding, your student will create a complete setting that could be the basis of a future novel, film, or game. We will look at real-world and fantasy worlds that your student can use to create a unique setting of their own.

Your student will learn:

- How to design fantasy maps that create a wealth of narrative opportunities
- To create fictional cultures based on real-world examples
- How to build fantastic, but believable, villages, cities, and whole nations
